CONSERVATION



At present, we are consuming the equivalent of 1.5 planets worth of resources to support human activities. As global citizens we all need to find ways to do more with less. There is something each of us can do to stop living in a world of more and start living in a world of enough. The individual choices we can all collectively make to live within the means of our only planet, have the potential to create a better world, inspire our children and their children, and send signals to the world's leaders that this is the future we desire.

Look for Aquaculture Stewardship Council labels on farmed shrimp and salmon and other farmed fish to eliminate the water pollution and spread of diseases to marine life and nearby human communities.

Look for seafood companies that avoid "bycatch", one of the greatest threats to many marine turtle populations, which can be prevented by using "turtle lights" to illuminate gillnets or for circle hooks to catch tuna and mahi mahi but not sea turtles.

Purchase forest products certified by the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC). Any wood furniture with the FSC mark on it means it comes from responsibly managed forest, one which offers economic opportunity but which protects wildlife habitats.
